

fdisk (list and edit disk partitions)

fdisk is Linux's traditional disk partitioning tool. It has been largely supplanted by graphical partition editors such as GParted. However, *fdisk* is still useful for getting quick partitioning info on the command line. Try running this command:

```
sudo fdisk -l
```

This will list all partitions of all disks available on your system along with their size (in blocks), file system type, etc. The prefix →[*sudo*](#) is necessary because *fdisk* is an administrative tool residing in root's executable path. If you want to do any actual partitioning work on the command line, I recommend using *cfdisk*, which offers an interactive menu and is more intuitive to use than *fdisk*.
